Learning Matters – or how to help your child earn a million dollars

Well, sort of! This week our staff did some learning about the Science of Reading which reinforced what we know- that Reading is fundamental to every other bit of learning. So if you want your child to have the million dollars here's a safe bet to get them underway. Make sure they know their nursery rhymes. Now you'll think I'm mad but it works like this: Knowing about rhyming and rhythm is an important first skill in learning your letters and sounds. Kids who miss out on those rhymes and rhythms generally find learning to read harder.

STEP 2 Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.

STEP 3 Complete all mandatory fields.

Please note: you cannot submit your application unless all mandatory fields are complete.

STEP 4 Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.

STEP 5 Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button.

Please note: if you exit the form without clicking 'SUBMIT' your details will be lost.

You can save the form, and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the 'SAVE' button.





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Parking Around Schools

Due to the chaotic nature of traffic around schools at peak times, streets can be an extremely dangerous place for children.

Young children have not yet fully developed their cognitive abilities and therefore their perception, judgement and awareness of potentially dangerous situations is not adequately developed to enable them to cope with the road traffic.

Children are not easily visible and often act impulsively, which means if you are driving around a school take special care, to ensure we keep our children safe. Remember that children copy grown-ups - encourage good road sense by watching them closely and leading by example.

5 Helpful Tips for School Zones

As parents and caregivers we have a great responsibility to ensure children stay safe in school zones. We also play a key role in educating children about road safety.

Here are 5 helpful tips for safety in school zones:

- 1. Allow enough time to take your child to the school gate safely and without rushing.
- 2. Always observe parking signs and speed limits in and around school zones. They are designed to keep your child safe.
- Talk about signs and traffic lights with your child. Identify and discuss places where it is safe to get out of the car and cross the road.
- 4. Teach your child how to cross the road using the 'stop, look and listen' process stop at the kerb, look and listen for traffic and then decide whether it is safe to cross.
- 5. Park a few streets away and walk your child to school. This is also good exercise and helps teach your child road safety rules.

Behaviours to Avoid

- Speeding
- Double Parking
- Parking too close to an intersection
- Parking across driveways
- Parking too close to pedestrian crossings
