TESTING TIMES

We're in a testing flurry over the next few weeks. No, not for Covid (touch wood) but significant testing of Reading, Writing and Spelling for our students. The year 1s are doing their "Phonics Checklist" tests, the years 1 to 7 are doing the national online PAT tests and all classes are doing a "Running Record" of where reading is up to. All classes years 1 to 7 are also doing a Writing test!

Whew!

We're quite excited about the testing results because, with a change in approach to teaching Reading and Spelling over the last year, we're hoping for evidence of even greater growth in our student results.

STAFF TRAINING DAY NEXT MONDAY

All staff are participating in training next Monday about how best to look after and teach students who have experienced trauma in their lives. This will enable us to develop practices that will help children settle in, engage with their class mates and their learning and move towards being successful at school.



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Parking Around Schools

Due to the chaotic nature of traffic around schools at peak times, streets can be an extremely dangerous place for children.

Young children have not yet fully developed their cognitive abilities and therefore their perception, judgement and awareness of potentially dangerous situations is not adequately developed to enable them to cope with the road traffic.

Children are not easily visible and often act impulsively, which means if you are driving around a school take special care, to ensure we keep our children safe. Remember that children copy grown-ups encourage good road sense by watching them closely and leading by example.

5 Helpful Tips for School Zones

As parents and caregivers we have a great responsibility to ensure children stay safe in school zones. We also play a key role in educating children about road safety.

Here are 5 helpful tips for safety in school zones:

- Allow enough time to take your child to the school gate safely and without rushing.
- 2. Always observe parking signs and speed limits in and around school zones. They are designed to keep your child safe.
- Talk about signs and traffic lights with your child. Identify and discuss places where it is safe to get out of the car and cross the road.
- 4. Teach your child how to cross the road using the 'stop, look and listen' process stop at the kerb, look and listen for traffic and then decide whether it is safe to cross.
- 5. Park a few streets away and walk your child to school. This is also good exercise and helps teach your child road safety rules.

Behaviours to Avoid

- Speeding
- Double Parking
- Parking too close to an intersection
- Parking across driveways
 - Parking too close to pedestrian crossings
