Just a reminder of our school uniform policy. All students need to be in school uniform. Lost property is located in the bins near the library. Please name all items.








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Key lesson outcomes


Science this term 4.12 have been engaged with Earth and Space. Students have been learning about the planets, space shuttles and how we get Night and Day.




