

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# More important information

### Teaching and Learning

The Education Department in the last three years has set out to make SA have a World Class Education system by 2028. Each school contributes to that in our individual school plans, and North School is focussing on lining up our teaching and learning practices at each year level to develop a consistent approach. We want to make sure no student misses our on their entitled learning and that the right interventions and extensions are happening when they are required.

### Children's University

We will be participating in Children's University again in 2022. At MBNS students from year 3-6 are invited to participate in this awesome opportunity. Last year we had 15 kids head down to Bonython Hall at Adelaide University to Graduate.

### What is Children's University?

Children's University (CU) aims to encourage high quality out of school activities for children, engaging the wider community as learning partners in this process. The most important principles of CU are that participation is voluntary and activities must take place outside the normal school day during lunch, after school, weekends and holidays.

Led by the University of Adelaide, CU aims to nurture aspirations and develop a love of learning. Children and young people enrolled in CU are issued with a *Passport to Learning* which records their individual learning journey. After the first 30 hours of learning, children are rewarded for their participation at a graduation ceremony held at the University of Adelaide or a prestigious venue in regional areas. Children can graduate multiple times depending on the hours they accrue.
