## Material and Services Charge (School Fees) – 2023

Each year the Department for Education (DECD) determines how much schools are entitled to charge parents and caregivers for their children attending school.

The amount we ask parents to pay is the recommended level of payment and this forms a key part of our budgeting.

The amount that DfE allows us to charge students for attending this school and access our materials and services is \$269.00. This is an increase of \$16 on last year.

We use this 'Materials and Services' money to meet key costs in the school including books, writing materials plus costs associated with the internet and photocopying materials for learning.

Should there be any questions or issues with the Materials and Services Charge, there is an opportunity for parents and caregivers to raise these at a meeting at 6.00 p.m. on Tuesday the 1st of November, 2022 at the school.

In lieu of attendance at the meeting, parents and carers are invited to express their views in writing addressed to the Chair Person of Governing Council marked "Confidential – Materials and Services".


